Where possible travel alone or only with people from your household. If you may be exposed to the Covid-19 virus	Staff, contractors and others	Serious ill- health conditions	3	5	15	 If you have symptoms of coronavirus (new cough and/or high temperature), you must self-isolate, stay at home for seven days. If you live in a household with someone who has the symptoms above, you must stay at home for 14 days from the day their symptoms started. If you develop symptoms, you must stay at home for seven days from the start of your symptoms. BAME groups are seen to be a higher risk than others. Currently there is no specific guidance or measures recommended from the government for this group therefore we highly recommend that you follow the normal government guidance on coronavirus. Use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available. Wash your hands regularly throughout the day but also before and after each delivery. Use hand sanitiser regularly throughout the day if soap and water not available. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze. Dispose of tissues in appropriate waste receptacles as quickly as possible. {Dust/ pedal bin}. Maintain the two-metre distance rule at all times where possible. If not possible to keep to the two-metre distance rule then relevant PPE (Face Mask, Face Visor or a combination of the two)this is mandatory for all shop staff to wear .
